

A meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Sidney, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 7:15 P.M. on September 11, 2012 in the Council Room. Present were: Mayor Gaston and Council Members: Weiderspon, Nienhueser, Van Vleet and Gallaway. Others present: City Manager Person, City Attorney Leef and City Clerk Anthony. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in *The Sidney Sun Telegraph*, the designated method for giving notice, a copy of the proof of publication being attached to these minutes. Advance notice of the meeting was also given to the members of the City Council and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the City Council. All proceedings shown hereafter were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Mayor publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review and indicated the location of such copy posted in the room where the meeting was being held.

Nienhueser moved, Gallaway seconded "That the minutes of the August 28, 2012 meeting be approved." Roll call vote: Yeas: Nienhueser, Gaston, Gallaway and Van Vleet. Nays: None. Abstain: Weiderspon.

Ten seconds of silence was had in remembrance of September 11, 2001 for those who died and for those who saved lives.

Whereupon Mayor Gaston announced that the Planning Commission of the City of Sidney, NE has submitted to the City Council its final report recommending approval of the rezoning request of the Sidney Housing Authority for a portion of Tracts 1 & 2, Wellner's Third Addition to the City of Sidney, Cheyenne County, NE from R-1 (Single Family Residential) to R-3 (Heavy Density Multi-Family Residential) Zone and that a public hearing would now be held and parties in interest would be heard as advertised. The following filed written comments: Nancy Bentley. The following appeared in person or by agent or by attorney and were heard: City Manager Person, Tamara Nelsen, Housing Authority Chairman and Roger Gallaway, member of the Housing Authority. All persons having been heard, Mayor Gaston closed the public hearing.

RESOLUTION NO. 20120901

WHEREAS, Lee Jacobsen is the owner of real estate at 2397 Whitetail Drive, within the corporate limits of the City, more particularly described as follows: Lot 1, Block 4, Deer Run Park; and

WHEREAS, there is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference a plan of the above-described real estate, which shows a proposed 72 inch vinyl fence which the owner proposes 16 feet into the Right of Way of College Drive.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Sidney, Nebraska, does hereby grant permission and conveys a non-exclusive temporary easement to the above-named owner of the above-described real estate, their heirs, devisees, personal representatives and assigns, for construction of a 72 inch vinyl fence to extend from the existing fence approved by Resolution No. 20060601, a total of 16' towards and within the Public Right of Way of College Drive a total distance of 60' in a Westerly direction, conditioned on the following:

1. The fence will be built of materials that may be easily removed by the owner or owners at their expense at any time upon the request of the City of Sidney, including but not limited to such things as to install or maintain

utility services, sidewalk construction or repair, widening of streets or other use of said right-of-way by the City; and

2. Owner is responsible for all costs and accepts all liability for repair, replacement, maintenance, removal or destruction of the fence and City shall not be responsible for same; and
3. The Owner, in consideration for permission and the non-exclusive easement, holds the City harmless and will indemnify City for any claim, damages or judgment regarding replacement, repair, removal or any personal injury arising in association with said fence.
4. The Owners, upon approval by Council, shall obtain a building permit to construct such fence according to the requirements of the applicable ordinances and codes.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SIDNEY, NEBRASKA: That the Mayor and Council hereby find and determine that pursuant to a contract heretofore made, Baker & Associates, the engineer have performed the work for engineering of street improvements in Street Improvement District No. 51 of this city and the engineer has filed with the City Clerk certificates showing the performance of said contract as follows: APPLICATION FOR PAYMENT NUMBER 2; STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT #51; AMOUNT DUE ENGINEER \$2,120.00. A warrant in the amount now due the engineer is hereby authorized and charged to said district. Said warrants shall draw interest at a rate of 1.0% per annum and be held by the City of Sidney Investment Account.

All persons who desired a hearing having been heard, Mayor Gaston closed the hearing.

RESOLUTION NO. 20120903

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1601.02 provides that the property tax request for the prior year shall be the property tax request for the current year for purposes of the levy set by the County Board of Equalization unless the Governing Body of the City of Sidney passes, by a majority vote, a resolution or ordinance setting the tax request at a different amount; and

WHEREAS, a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the property tax request; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the City of Sidney that the property tax request for the current year be a different amount than the property tax request for the prior year.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Sidney, Nebraska, by a majority vote resolves that:

1. The 2012-2013 property tax request be set at \$1,714,060.90 (\$1,388,579.31 for the General/Street and \$325,481.59 for Debt Service).
