

Sidney, Nebraska, October 8, 2013 A Fair Housing City

A meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Sidney, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 7:15 P.M. on October 8, 2013 in the Council Room. Present were: Mayor Gaston and Council Members: Gallaway, Nienhueser, Gay and Arterburn. Others present: City Manager Person, City Attorney Leef, and City Clerk Anthony. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in *The Sidney Sun Telegraph*, the designated method for giving notice, a copy of the proof of publication being attached to these minutes. Advance notice of the meeting was also given to the members of the City Council and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the City Council. City Manager Person presented requests for improvement districts from M.P. Patel of Krishna Management, Inc. as well as reviewing the East Old Post Road development plan which encompasses the property involved in all of the improvement districts. Two districts are for paving of Silverberg Drive and for Jennifer Lane. Also, in the request are water extension and sewer extension districts. The City has made a request to the Nebraska Department of Roads for opening an access point for Jennifer Lane at Link Road 17-J. Silverberg Drive extension does impact other adjacent landowners; i.e. Wilkinson Development, Wal-Mart and Ehrlich Development. Council Member Nienhueser stressed the importance of proper storm water drainage for this development.

That ratification of retainage of Baker & Associates as special engineers for the City of Sidney for the preparation of plans, specifications and estimates for the necessary work needed for Street Improvement District No. 53, Street Improvement District No. 54, Sanitary Sewer Extension District No. 21, and Water Extension District No. 21 and for the supervision and inspection of such work in said districts; and for the performance of any other engineering services in connection therewith; and

That stormwater management be included in the redevelopment plan/improvement districts; and That the engineer, Baker & Associates is authorized to proceed with the detailed specifications and engineer's cost estimates, including the general stipulations thereto attached for the construction of cement concrete paved streets with curb and gutter, sidewalks and intersections, storm drain piping and appurtenances, a sanitary sewer main, and a water main and appurtenances, stormwater management and all other necessary incidental improvements thereto, as applicable, for Street Improvement District No. 53, Street Improvement District No. 54, Sanitary Sewer Extension District No. 21, and Water Extension District No. 21.

Jack Baker of Baker & Associates announced that his firm would be establishing a new office with one of their engineers on site at a location on Illinois Street in Sidney.

RESOLUTION NO. 20131004

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SIDNEY, NEBRASKA:

That in accordance with the power vested in them by Sections 424.01, 460.01, 460.02 and 460.13 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Sidney, 1977, the following traffic regulatory markings shall be placed as hereafter indicated and that all vehicles using the streets of the City comply with the regulations and prohibitions

hereafter set forth:

STOP SIGN

Stop signs shall be placed as follows: (a) At a point being 1,681 (one-thousand six-hundred and eighty-one) feet west of the intersection of Elm Street and Greenwood Road. Said sign shall be placed facing westbound traffic on Elm Street and (b) At a point being 1,898 (one-thousand eight-hundred and ninety-eight) feet west of the intersection of Elm Street and Greenwood Road. Said sign shall be placed facing eastbound traffic on Elm Street.

All markings and signs shall be placed in accordance to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices” and the regulation and prohibitions of such signs and markings shall be effective twenty-four hours per day.

Discussion regarding a tow contract with Affordable Towing as per the bid accepted by City Council on September 24, 2013 precipitated in comments from two other Sidney towing companies; i.e. Brad Zalesky and Hall Zalesky. They felt the specifications of the bid package had been changed in regards to providing a fenced location for the abandoned vehicles. They felt if they had known they didn't have to have a location they would have been able to bid. Police Chief BJ Wilkinson commented that the Police Department already had a system in place to call for tow companies when the need arose for all other types of tows. He thought that system might suffice for the abandoned vehicle tows also. City Attorney Leef interjected that at this point, no action could be taken other than approve the proposed contract with Affordable Towing since the Council had awarded the bid to that company. The item was tabled until the next meeting so that all parties involved could be contacted.

City Manager's report consisted of updates of recent and upcoming meetings and/or events; i.e.: Newcomer's Picnic 9-26, League Annual conference 10/9-11, Police Station feasibility study granted to Baker & Associates, Golf project contracts being finalized with work to start soon, October 15 for removing boats, campers, etc. from City streets, Landfill is now closed on Saturday until next spring, copies of the Property Maintenance Code were given to the Council for their study, reported on Raffaelson Rock's grinding business plans, kudos to the Oktoberfest Committee in their handling of another inclimate festival weekend, State Chamber's legislative forum 10/16, City Auction at Police Department on 10/19 at 10 a.m., etc. City Manager Person also broached the subject of changing the name of the new street from Toledo to something more community recognizable. A contest to name it may be held.

Council Member Gallaway mentioned comments he had heard regarding moving the Oktoberfest two weeks earlier in September to avoid weather issues. Mayor Gaston thanked the police officers for the efficient handling of the Oktoberfest parade, etc.
