A meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Sidney, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 7:15 P.M. on June 9, 2015 in the Council Room. Present were: Mayor Nienhueser and Council Members: Gallaway, Gaston, Gay, and Arterburn. Others Present: City Manager Person, City Attorney Leef and City Clerk Anthony. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in *The Sidney Sun Telegraph*, the designated method for giving notice, a copy of the proof of publication being attached to these minutes. Advance notice of the meeting was also given to the members of the City Council and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the City Council. All proceedings shown hereafter were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Mayor Nienhueser informed the public of the location of the posted Open Meetings Act.

Mayor Nienhueser announced that a public hearing would now be held as advertised for the Retail Class C liquor license application for JC Industries dba Sidney Fine Arts Center at 1000 11th Avenue, Sidney, Cheyenne County, Nebraska, and the Manager Application of Todd Flick for same. The following filed written objections to said application: None. The following appeared in person or by agent or by attorney and were heard: Todd Flick answered questions in regards to the license application. All persons having been heard, the Mayor closed the public hearing.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SIDNEY, NEBRASKA AS FOLLOWS:

That the Mayor and Council of the City of Sidney, Nebraska hereby recommends approval of the issuance of a Class C liquor license to JC Industries dba Sidney Fine Arts Center at 1000 11th Avenue, Sidney, Cheyenne County, Nebraska; and

That the Mayor and Council of the City of Sidney, Nebraska hereby recommends approval of the manager application of Todd Flick for said license; and

That the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission be notified of said recommendations.

Pursuant to the publicized notice that the Mayor and Council would hold a public hearing at this time and place for the purpose of discussing the completion of the North Side Street Project which was funded in part by State of Nebraska Department of Economic Development Community Development Block Grant. This grant was available to local governments for community development activities. The City of Sidney was awarded Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars - \$340,000.00 for paving of approximately four blocks on the North side of Sidney, including one block of 17th Street and Three blocks of Forrest Street and \$10,000 for administration of the grant funds. \$390,300.00 of the total estimated cost of \$740,300.00 will be provided by the City of Sidney. The total amount of the Community Development Block Grant Funds, \$350,000, benefited low and moderate income individuals in the City of Sidney. No individuals were displaced by the Community Development Block Grant funds. The Mayor then stated that the Council was in session for such purpose and all persons would be heard. The following filed written objections: None. The following appeared in person or by agent or by attorney and were heard: Jeff Kelley of Panhandle Area Development District reviewed Notice of Public Hearing and the purpose for said public hearing. Public Services Director John Hehnke reported that the City is satisfied with the finished product. There being no further comments, the Mayor closed the hearing at 7:30 P.M.

WHEREAS, the new Community Development Block Grant requirements mandate that the governing body have public hearings "before" and "after" projects are completed; and

City of Sidney Transportation Project

The City of Sidney Transportation Project (CSTP) operates a transit program serving the residents of Sidney, Nebraska, situated in Cheyenne County. As a condition of receiving Federal financial assistance to operate these services, the agency ensures that its programs, policies, and activities comply with the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.

WHEREAS, there are federal funds available under Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act (FTA) and for the Nebraska Public Transportation Act Funds that require a Title VI policy to be in place; and

WHEREAS, City of Sidney Transportation Project agrees to adopt the 2015 Title VI Non-Discrimination Plan for transit operations in the City of Sidney, located in Cheyenne County.
