

Sidney, Nebraska, September 13, 2016, A Fair Housing City

A meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Sidney, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 7:15 P.M. on September 13, 2016 in the Council Room. Present were: Mayor Nienhueser and Council Members: Gallaway, Gaston, Gay, and Arterburn. Others Present: City Manager Sadler, City Clerk Anthony and City Attorney Leef. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in *The Sidney Sun Telegraph*, the designated method for giving notice, a copy of the proof of publication being attached to these minutes. Advance notice of the meeting was also given to the members of the City Council and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the City Council. All proceedings shown hereafter were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Mayor Nienhueser informed the public of the location of the posted Open Meetings Act.

Gallaway moved, Gaston seconded "That the minutes of the August 23, 2016 meeting be approved as printed." Roll call vote: Yeas: All council members present. Abstain: Arterburn. Gay moved, Gallaway seconded "That the minutes of the September 1, 2016 meeting be approved as printed." Roll call vote: Yeas: All council members present. Abstain: Gaston.

Andrew Sherman commended the City for a great opening year for the new Aquatic Center.

Mayor Nienhueser announced that a public hearing would now be held, at 7:15 p.m., for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions, or observations relating to the 2016-2017 proposed budget statement for all City departments, the tax levy, unused budget authority, and to consider amendments relative thereto. City Manager Sadler presented a power point presentation of the proposed budget statement and reviewed same. There being no further public comment, the hearing was closed at 7:34 p.m.

Mayor Nienhueser announced that a public hearing would now be held, at 7:34 p.m., for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions, or observations relating to adopting a tax request different than the prior year tax request and that all persons would be heard. The following filed written objections: None. The following appearing in person or by agent or by attorney and were heard: City Manager Sadler. All persons who desired a hearing having been heard, Mayor Nienhueser closed the hearing at 7:36 p.m.

Gallaway moved, Gay seconded "That RESOLUTION NO. 20160901 be passed and adopted." Roll call vote: Yeas: All council members present.

RESOLUTION NO. 20160901

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1601.02 provides that the property tax request for the prior year shall be the property tax request for the current year for purposes of the levy set by the County Board of Equalization unless the Governing Body of the City of Sidney passes, by a majority vote, a resolution or ordinance setting the tax request at a different amount; and

WHEREAS, a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the property tax request; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the City of Sidney that the property tax request for the current year be a different amount than the property tax request for the prior year.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Sidney, Nebraska, by a majority vote resolves that:

1. The 2016-2017 property tax request be set at \$2,089,077.94 (\$1,373,955.94. for the General/Street and \$715,122.00 for Debt Service).

2. A copy of this resolution be certified and forwarded to the County Clerk prior to October 13, 2016.

Gaston moved, Gallaway seconded “That the City Council approve a 1% increase in restricted funds for the tax levy lid calculations for FY2016-2017.” Roll call vote: Yeas: All council members present.

Gaston moved, Gallaway seconded “That the Ordinance entitled “AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE BUDGET STATEMENT TO BE TERMED THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BILL, TO APPROPRIATE SUMS FOR NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ALL PURPOSE LEVY FOR ALL OBJECTS OR PURPOSES; TO PROVIDE FOR FILING OF COPIES OF THE BUDGET DOCUMENT WITH THE AUDITOR OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS AND THE CHEYENNE COUNTY CLERK; AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND TAKE EFFECT” be designated as Ordinance No. 1779.” Roll call vote: Yeas: All council members present. Gaston moved, Gallaway seconded “That the Statutory requirement requiring the ordinance to be read by title three different days be suspended.” Roll call vote: Yeas: All council members present. The motion having been concurred in by three-fourths of the Council be declared passed and adopted and said statutory requirement suspended. The City Clerk then read the Ordinance by number. Gay moved, Gallaway seconded “That Ordinance No. 1779 be finally passed.” Roll call vote: Yeas: All council members present. The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred in by a majority of all members of the City Council was declared passed and adopted and the Mayor in the presence of the City Council signed and affixed his signature thereto. Arterburn moved, Gallaway seconded “That Ordinance No. 1779 be published in The Sidney Sun Telegraph.” Roll call vote: Yeas: All council members present.

Gallaway moved, Arterburn seconded “That RESOLUTION NO. 20160902 be passed and adopted.” Roll call vote: Yeas: All council members present.

Sidney Airport Authority members, Jarrod Konz, Chairman, Jeff Barry, Vice-Chairman and Ron Meyer, Authority Member presented a report regarding the last year and the coming year. Highlights for the last year were: 1. New terminal building was completed which was funded by Federal Aviation Agency and the State Department of Aeronautics. 2. Procuring a new manager of operations. 3. Received the Airport of the Year Award for the State of Nebraska. 4. New business at airport – Ballard Aviation. Next year’s plans are to redo the Master Layout Plan as recommended by the State and working with the Department of Aeronautics as it is required in order to receive further Federal Funds. Mr. Meyer spoke on the progressive and positive nature of the Sidney Airport to its customers which in turn draws more pilots to use for refueling, etc. Council Member Gaston congratulated the Authority on the Airport of the Year Award. Council Member Gallaway remarked on what a nice building the terminal is now.

Don Dye of M.C. Schaff appeared to update the Council on the Pole Creek Crossing and Greenwood Road projects. The weed situation was addressed and Renkowski has been hired to spray the areas of concern. Another point of concern is the signage for the new hospital and if it could be better. WHEREAS, the City of Sidney, Nebraska, does hereby request the Nebraska State of Nebraska Department Road's permission for closure of Illinois (Highway 30) Street for the Parade of Lights. The closure would be on December 3, 2016, from 4:30 p.m. and reopen to traffic at 7:00 p.m. The closure will be between the intersections of 15th Avenue and 7th Avenue with Highway 30. The City of Sidney accepts the duties as set forth in subsection (2) of Nebraska Revised Statutes 39-1359 and agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the State from all claims, demands, actions, damages, and liability, including reasonable attorney's fees that may arise as a result of the special event. The City staff will place all required barricades and detour signage in order to have all streets accessing Highway 30 closed for the parade and will follow directly behind the parade removing all barricades and opening Highway 30 back to normal traffic. Most intersections along the parade route will have barricades closing them.
